The objective of Subsig is to encourage and to help all, especially young people, and those of limited means to a greater knowledge, love and care of the countryside, to develop their self-reliance and independence, and to promote their physical health and education by spending more time in the open air through participation in skiing, snowshoeing hiking, canoeing, camping, bicycling, mountaineering and allied activities.

MESSAGE FROM THE TRIPS DIRECTOR.

A handful of volunteers dedicated over 1500 volunteer hours to trip operations last year. That is the reason that Cabin Usage and the number of trips were so high. The actions and duties of those volunteers without payment is Volunteer Capacity. Subsig does not have as much capacity this year, and that is a challenge for trip operations and activities.

Some suggestions to rebuild volunteer capacity are starting to percolate during Cabin conversations. This is a suitable time to have a one-hour Roundtable session to discuss the challenges.
